It's great to know that the work of the volunteers, trustees and management committee has been recognised in this way.



Mega bulb planting weekend

The last weekend of October saw people gathering to plant over 1,700 bulbs across the site. We were rather let down by the weather forecast but both days turned out sunny and all the bulbs were planted.

It was great to see children taking part as most of the work that's been going on hasn't been suitable for those under-14.

The Committee prepared the ground so that it was easy for volunteers to put the bulbs in.

In the spring there will be crocuses, bluebells, blue and white anemones, camassia and wild garlic.

More archaeological finds

An archaeological find in the Orchard

It's identical to one featured in the November 2021 edition of *Current Archaeology* (issue 380) found during excavations of Hyde Abbey on the outskirts of Winchester.

The Hyde Abbey site had been used as a Bridewell (a small prison) from 1788 to 1840 and the inkwell dates from that era.

We are building quite a collection of finds. The Hendon and District Archaeological Society (HADAS) also has some finds from excavations carried out in the 1970s.

Future projects

Three 'rustic' benches will be arriving for the Orchard before the end of November. Do go and try them out.

Two park benches are expected in the next few months for the Green Field.

New trees should be planted in the Orchard by the end of the year.

The Committee is starting to plan a new landscaping at the top of the Green Field where trees have had to be felled. Do let us have your thoughts.

We will be applying to the Woodland Trust for hedging to plant along the fence with Cedar Court.

The Committee is also thinking of making a sensory garden in this area. This would be in a raised bed made of railway sleepers.

A memorial acer has been donated by a local resident, which volunteers hope to plant at end of November.
