Welcome to the June edition of our newsletter.

Our **Barnet Spacehive crowdfunding** campaign now has 50 backers who between them have pledged £2,446 to our project to raise money for 4 mature trees and a hand pump. Barnet Council is the 50^{th} backer and has contributed £1,326, so we are now over half way to our target.

Thanks to all those who have donated. Please spread the word amongst your family, friends and neighbours.

If you have pledged, it would be great if you are able to increase your pledge. Remember, the money will not be collected by Spacehive if we do not reach our target of £4,735. See below for how to donate.

The Orchard

We have taken the names for the three areas of the site from old maps. The Orchard is the most hidden part of the site and is sandwiched between the back of Chilvins Court on Nether Street, Penstemon Close and Cedar Court.



Since work parties started again in April, we have focused on making trails through this area.

If you have logs, please get in touch as we can use them for the paths and for seating. Following the findings of last year's consultation, we are working towards making the Orchard a wildlife area with some informal seating for quiet reflection.

This has meant removing some of the bramble that had colonised much of the Orchard. We will then plant a more diverse range of flora to encourage a greater variety of wildlife onto the site.

Our Spacehive crowdfunding campaign aims to get this planting started.
