#### Seats on the Green Field

Independently from FoFWOS a local resident has worked with Barnet Council to have two benches installed on the Green Field in memory of members of her family.

The trustees feel this is a good addition to the site as it makes it more welcoming for many people. Now you can sit in comfort and watch your children play or just read in the sunshine.

The bench opposite the Finchley Way entrance is in memory of the actor Hal Jeayes who lived in Woodside Park.


He appeared in numerous plays and TV programmes including Z cars, Crossroads, London's Burning, The Professionals and Pennies from Heaven, as well as many commercials.

Hal also spent a few years in the long running West End theatre production of The Mousetrap.

Besides being an actor he was a professional theatrical photographer and photographed many famous faces including Victoria Beckham and some of the cast of East Enders.

The bench at the bottom of the Green Field is in memory of Jenny Butcher OBE and Laurie Butcher who lived in Totteridge.

Laurie was an avid autograph collector and prided himself on having collected all of them personally. The collection included "every UK prime minister since the second world war including Churchill" and many from the entertainment industry in Britain and the US.

There were autograph books, signed photos and theatre programmes as well as signed biographies and autobiographies.

The entire collection raised over £70,000 for the North London Hospice in Woodside Park.

Which autograph raised the most? A joint one of John Lennon and Yoko Ono.

Perhaps surprisingly John Profumo and Christine Keeler didn't get one bid in the first auction!

Jenny trained as a ballet dancer but pursued a career in acting. She later gave up the "precarious life of acting" to work for the post office and subsequently Customs & Excise. After 23 years she received an OBE for her outstanding contribution to Customs & Excise North & West Collection.
