Three of the founding trustees are stepping down at the end of their terms this December. Richard Bartholomew and Samuel Levy, although both will continue to volunteer, and Chair, Suzanne King.

All can stand for re-election after a one-year break.

Goodbye from the Chair

After more than six years of being involved with Friends of Finchley Way Open Space, including setting it up as a charity, I am handing over the reins.

Making the site what it is has been very much a team effort.

The team starts with **Augustus Cooper** who bequeathed the site to
Finchley Borough Council on his death
in 1939.



Unfortunately, we don't have a photo or any likeness of him and know very little about his life, other than that he was a watchmaker.

The idea of protecting what is now Finchley Way Open Space was born as part of developing the Neighbourhood Plan.

In the summer of 2019, Roger Chapman (Chair of Cherry Tree Wood in East Finchley) held a meeting of Friends groups in Barnet. At the end of that meeting Alan Douglas and I decided to start a Friends group for the open space.

We designed and had printed a leaflet and delivered it to addresses within about 0.4km of the site.

It invited residents to a meeting at Finchley Lawn Tennis Club on 19 December 2019. (They kindly let us meet there free of charge.) At that meeting a committee was elected and a constitution agreed.

By February 2020 Karen Goodman had become Treasurer and later Nick Dimant became Deputy Chair and the Executive Committee team was formed.

In mid-2020, Matt Gunyon (Head of Greenspaces and Trees at Barnet) suggested that the Friends group become a charity as this would enable access to a wider range of financial support.

In December 2020 Friends of Finchley Way was registered as a charity.

I'm leaving the charity in good hands with six trustees continuing and three new trustees this year.

There are also about a dozen volunteers who come regularly. You don't have to be a trustee or to have any knowledge of gardening to join in. Jobs vary in the level of physical ability needed.
