Benches in the Orchard

On Friday 19th November Ian Varley from Rustic Carpentry delivered three hand-carved benches for the Orchard.

With help from his mate Simon and one of our Management Committee (also Simon) the solid oak benches were hauled into position and dug in. This was no easy task as the benches are very heavy, as you can see.

The wood comes from trees that are being felled for maintenance or building work. They were not felled specifically to make the benches.

Creating benches is giving the trees another lease of life. They should last for many years.





These benches are a great addition to the Orchard. They blend in with the aim of making this part of the site a native wildlife habitat, while giving us humans the opportunity to sit and ponder the wildlife, planting and life in general.





Planting on the Green Field

Removing the trees at the top of the Green Field because of subsidence to Cedar Court has left a gap.

At the November work party a family planted a small acer in memory of their father.

It had been hoped that this would be the beginning of rejuvenating this area without causing problems to the building.

Wilson Lloyd, a local gardening company, has donated a cherry tree (prunus avium plena), which we thought could also be planted at the top of the Green Field.

BUT...

After digging three holes we realised that the arched brick cellars of Brent Lodge had been uncovered.

A new location for the tree will have to be found.

This will greatly restrict what can be done at the top of the Green Field.

It doesn't look much now but it will bring beautiful colour in the spring.

End of year celebration

The December work party stopped early and volunteers were joined by more supporters for seasonal treats.

A lot has been achieved since work re-started at the end of April this year.

Most impressively, the central area of the Orchard has been dug over and the roots of the bramble have been removed. This took some serious digging by many different people but we got there in the end.

The other major achievement is that paths have been cut and edged in the Orchard, creating a circular walk and all the paths have been covered in wood chip.

The installation of the interpretation board at the Finchley Way entrance helps to make the site more welcoming.

The bird and animal boards at the entrance to the Copse have proved a hit. We often see people reading them. Hopefully the bird boxes will be inhabited next year.

The brick wall in the Orchard has been made safe by the Council. This has enabled the other entrance to be opened and another route round the site to be cut. The clearance has created a great vista long the wall. Documentation found recently shows that the wall was built between 1810 and 1830.

Lastly, some of the fences have been replaced, making the site look neater.

In the centre of the Orchard the earth is currently resting under porous membrane.

It is hoped that shrubs and other planting will be done over the winter.

In the spring we hope to see the 1,700 bulbs planted at the end of October providing colour.
